WELCOME / INTRODUCTIONS

Dr. Walter Fitzgerald, BBBHC Chair / South College School of Pharmacy, welcomed everyone and asked everyone to introduce themselves. Thank you to South College School of Pharmacy for sponsoring lunch.

<u>UPDATES</u>

Dr. Fitzgerald announced that our April meeting will include a panel presentation on Sepsis and readmissions. If you have ideas on a speaker for this topic (or other topics), please contact Dr. Fitzgerald at wfitzgerald@southcollegetn.edu.

He also shared an update from the Morristown Coalition. They are meeting on the 4th Tuesday at 7:30am at Healthstar Physicians' Offices in Morristown. The group meets in January, April, July and October. Everyone is invited to attend. The coalition is currently focused on tracking readmissions for bounce backs to home health and skilled nursing facilities.

Aaron Bradley shared that the ETAAAD is working with legislators on the addiction issues. Will host a panel presentation in the future.

Dottie Lyvers shared information about the ETAAAD monthly education session, which is in partnership with the South College School of Pharmacy. All BBBHC members and friends are invited to attend. COMMUNITY STATUS UPDATE

Corley Roberts, Qsource, shared a quarterly community data update. Corley shared that there are 11 communities across TN. She noted that Sepsis is still the primary driver for readmissions, followed by CHF, COPD, and Psychosis respectively. Corley said that skilled nursing facilities and home health will begin being assessed penalties or incentives on October 1, 2018 for performance scores. CHARTER / STRATEGIC PLAN REVIEW

Article II – Mission

Current: To improve the safety and quality of care provided to the communities of East Tennessee through the development of sustainable person-centered care transitions and strengthening of relationships between community organizations and healthcare providers. Improvement efforts will be dedicated to reducing avoidable admissions and 30-day hospital readmissions. The Building a Bridge to Better Health Coalition includes the following counties: Anderson, Blount, Campbell, Claiborne, Cocke, Grainger, Hamblen, Jefferson, Knox, Loudon, Monroe, Morgan, Roane, Scott, Sevier and Union.

Discussion / Ideas Shared:

- Verbiage is cumbersome better what do we want to do
- Educating next generation of professionals too (not necessarily stated, but we are educating each other educating each other)
- Add something that focuses on improving health outcomes for patient / consumer statement about why we are doing this
- Question is the readmissions just for acute hospital readmission? = need to broaden don't restrict to just hospitals include others (SNF, home health).
 - Add a laundry list of those that are affected by readmissions
 - Historically was acute care hospitals now that is not the case.
- Need more hospital reps. to fill in goals gaps. Can try to find hospital reps to come and participate
- Mission could be broadened to include more groups
- If we become a forum for everyone to come to address issues of quality of care, not just readmissions of care
- Mission broad move reducing avoidable admissions and 30-day hospital readmissions to purpose.
- Consensus: write a more broad mission (currently too narrow)
- Resource coordination and dissemination
- Collect and disseminate resources that drive achieving the vision
- Mission is who we are and what we do
- Do we need a statement that encompasses the Governor's mission (smoking cessation, etc...)
- Mission should reflect the title (BBBHC)
- Creating the opportunity for collaboration, resource coordination, outcomes
- "Bridging"...
- Improvement efforts will be dedicated to reducing avoidable healthcare readmissions (might be purpose / goals instead)

- To improve the lives of East TN through a multi-disciplinary approach to improvements in healthcare across the care continuum.
- Keywords: bridge, collaboration, coordination
- To facilitate the collective value of everyone who cares for people in East TN. To identify problems, respond to public and private initiatives, to provide solutions.
- Final draft to work from: Creating the opportunity for collaboration, resource coordination, patient outcomes to improve the lives of East TN through a multidisciplinary approach to improvements in healthcare across the care continuum.
